Be Prepared for Accidents and Emergencies!

A Scout is always ready in body and mind to do his duty to help other people, facing danger if necessary. Are you Ready? Come and learn scout first aid skills that will last a lifetime.

The First-Aid Rally is held annually each year. The sessions are designed to follow the requirements for the Webelos First Responder Adventure. In addition, they will learn skills necessary for a Den to compete in the First-aid rally which follows in the afternoon. The training will be provided by Boy Scouts, adult Scouters, and other qualified First-aiders. All Units must provide two-deep leadership for all their participating Dens or Patrols. Each scout who attends will receive a First Responder Training booklet and event patch. We ask that all Scouts come in full uniform and bring a pencil with them to complete certain sections of their training booklet. A hotdog lunch will be available for purchase.

Scouts BSA First Aid Rally

Calling all Troops, Crews and Posts! Come test your First Aid Skills. Sharpen what you know and learn some more. This is a Patrol competition where you compete against other Scouts to see who is the best of the best. Be prepared. Be Safe. Have fun!!!

Equipment List

- All teams are responsible for supplying their own first aid supplies.
- Below is a list of suggested equipment that should be available for **<u>Each</u>** Den, Patrol, Crew, or Team.
- Do <u>Not</u> plan on groups being able to "share" supplies. Many of the competition problems involve multiple injuries and the team will need all their available supplies. Additionally, we cannot guarantee that teams will be placed close enough to each other to share supplies especially if they are competing at different levels.
- All supplies should have the Unit number or name on them in case something is misplaced or lost.

Recommended Kit Supplies

1 Pen/Pencil

```
12 Cravats/ Triangular bandages
5 Gauze Pads (4 x 4)
5 Rolls of Gauze (2" wide)
4 Splints (wood or plastic, avoid metal mesh type)
-2 Arm (approx. 3" x 15")
-2 Leg (approx. 4" x 30")
2 Blankets, heavy duty (used for stretcher and to keep patient warm)
6 pairs Non-Latex Gloves (One pair per team member)
1 Water Bottle
1 Note Pad
```

1 Equipment box or bag to hold all supplies neatly.

Do <u>Not</u> bring long poles for making a stretcher. Instruct scouts on using the blanket carry, it is safer in a crowded area.

First Aid Rally Rules

- A 6-person Patrol will be used. There will be no substituting of team members during the competition.
- Each Unit may bring as many Scouts as they wish. Event Staff will help with building provisional patrols to help achieve 6 person teams.
- Each problem will have a different leader and patient. No one shall be a leader or patient for more than one problem.
- You will be asked to transport your patient on the 2nd and 4th problems. Please select your patients accordingly.
- Teams will have a different judge for each problem.
- Judges may not judge in a division where their Unit has a team entered.
- Teams must give the judge their Unit number, team name, problem leader name and patient name before each problem begins.
- Teams will be given 10 minutes to complete each problem.
- Judges will then be given 5 minutes to discuss the team's actions and knowledge and complete the score sheet. **Score sheets get turned in after every problem.**
- Teams will have about 5 minutes to re-organize their gear and prepare for the next problem.
- When a team is ready to begin each problem, they are to stand in Patrol formation. As soon as
 they have a judge assigned for the problem, they will sit down and wait for the problem to be
 read.
- Only the problem leader may ask the judge questions. No other team member may communicate with the judge during or after the problem.
- Teams are not allowed to ask the judge what their score is for any problem. Score sheets will be available for pick-up at the end of the event.
- In the event an issue arises not covered by these rules, event staff will make every effort to come to a decision fair to all participants. **Staff decisions will be final.**

Practice Scenarios

1. Your Scout Unit is attending the Klondike Derby at Camp Schoellkopf and your Patrol decides to go sledding. While going down the hill, one of the sleds hits a bump and throws everyone off. One of the Scouts continues to slide down the hill and finally stops when he hits a tree. He is conscious and complaining of <u>pain in his left lower leg and right upper arm.</u> He has <u>a cut on his chin that is oozing blood</u> and he is feeling <u>lightheaded</u>.

2. Your Patrol is attending a roller-skating party sponsored by your neighborhood Cub Pack. One of the leaders was skating backwards when he runs over something lying on the floor. He falls, catching his fall with both hands. His <u>right wrist is painful to move and bleeding from a laceration on the top side of his wrist</u>. His <u>left hand is bruised</u>. He is <u>breathing fast</u>, his face is <u>very pale</u>, and he doesn't respond when spoken to.

Treat and Prepare to Transport

3. A group of Scouts are rock climbing at Philmont. One of the Scouts trips over a branch on the path and falls **cutting his forehead**. He is **lying face down**; his **left shoulder is drooping** and he is unable to move it his **lower right leg is deformed** and is very painful. He cannot stand.

Practice Scenarios (cont.)

4. As your team was practicing for this competition, you drop the youth while you were practicing a carry. He is now face up on the floor. His <u>right arm which is under him is bent at the elbow</u> and he cannot straighten it. He has pain in his <u>left knee</u> and a <u>laceration under his right eye</u>. He is becoming very <u>pale and has a rapid weak pulse</u>.

5. Your Patrol is visiting a local college campus during the University of Scouting. One of your friends was running to catch up with the Troop and he jumped over a low fence. Unfortunately, he didn't clear the top of the fence. He had put his hands out to break his fall and landed hard hitting his head. Upon reaching him, he is <u>face down</u>, he has <u>a pen sticking out of his right</u> <u>cheek and a bruise behind his right ear</u>. His <u>left leg is spurting bright red blood just above the ankle</u>.
